Assessing if notifications represent ESM

Describing the workflow and the information sources used when a competent authority is assessing a notification for a TBM.

➤ How can ESM be assured

- ✚ Which institutes and persons are involved and with what tasks
- ✚ what are the subsequent steps taken and what is the timing
- ✚ how is verified that the information in the notification documentation represents reality and corresponds to ESM and which sources of information are being used to do that verification
- ✚ how efficient and effective is this procedure and how could it be improved





Contribution to ESM and lessons to be learned

Contribution to ESM in participation countries

- ✚ Better assessments of notifications and therefore better decisions on cases where TBM is necessary
- ✚ Better use of the scarce capacity and resources within the competent authorities needed to assure TBM corresponds to ESM

Lessons for other countries

- ✚ Examples of typical work flow schemes and information gathering strategies
- ✚ Examples of improvement possibilities
- ✚ Potential to develop a self-assessment tool





How to get started?

- ✚ The project will be supported by an external consultant who will collect the information in the country, do the assessment, present the recommendations and prepares a report to the EWG
- ✚ We still need candidate countries that would be willing to be the subject of this assessment; preferably from developing countries or countries with economies in transition
- ✚ If funding allows it may be possible to do this in several countries simultaneously to provide different examples of good practice
