

**Table 13: Transboundary Movement of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes  
from OECD to non-OECD reporting Parties in 1998**

As at 15 October 2000 seventy-four Parties reported for the year 1998 in accordance with articles 13 & 16 of the Basel Convention. Forty-seven Parties reported data on the export of hazardous wastes and other wastes. Twenty Parties reported that no export of hazardous wastes and other wastes took place from their countries. Twenty-three Parties reported data on the import of hazardous wastes and other wastes. Forty Parties reported that no import of hazardous wastes and other wastes took place in their countries.

The export data indicates that out of the total quantity of wastes that moved from OECD to non-OECD countries, about 99% went for recycling followed by 1 % of wastes for which details concerning what happened to them are unavailable. The import data indicates that about 87 % went for recycling, followed by 10 % for disposal and for 3 % of wastes that moved across the borders from OECD to non-OECD details are unknown.

The export data shows that the largest quantity of wastes that moved from the OECD to non-OECD countries were waste streams Y1 - Y18 (89 %), whereas the import data shows that it was the wastes having specific constituent Y19 – Y47 (98 %) which consisted of Y19 – Y45 (88 %) and Y46 –Y47 (10 %).

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**Table 14: Transboundary Movement of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *Disposal* from OECD to non-OECD reporting Parties in 1998**

The export data indicates that there was no transboundary movement of hazardous wastes and other wastes neither for disposal nor for recycling purposes from OECD to non-OECD countries. The import data, however shows that 33 047 metric tonnes of household wastes moved from two OECD countries to a developed non-OECD country for incineration.

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**Table 15: Transboundary Movement of Hazardous Wastes and Other Wastes for *recycling* from OECD to non-OECD reporting Parties in 1998**

The export data shows that about 88 % of wastes were destined for reclamation of metals, inorganics and catalysts. Whereas the import data shows that about 100 % of wastes were destined for reclamation of metals, inorganics and catalysts.
