OBJECTIVE

Test alternative solutions to address plastic waste and tackle it at source, especially SUPs.

ACTIVITIES

- Establish a baseline inventory of SUPs
- Prepare recommendations and an implementation plan to replace SUPs
- Create 3 zero-plastic high schools
- Hold stakeholder consultation workshops on replacing SUPs
- Implement a pilot project to replace SUP bags with reusable alternatives



ACHIEVEMENTS

Baseline inventory of SUPs developed

Recommendations and implementation plan developed

Reusable bottles and water dispensers delivered to the schools

Zero-plastic plans developed and implemented at **2** schools
