

Institutional strengthening for the control of transboundary movement (TBM) and the improvement of environmentally sound management (ESM) of plastic waste in the Central America subregion

A project under the Small Grants Programme (SGP) on Plastic Waste (2021-2022)



OBJECTIVE

To strengthen the institutional and legal structure for the control of TBM, prevent illegal traffic, develop a national inventory and a national strategy for ESM of plastic waste as well as increased awareness in stakeholders to prevent and minimize the generation of marine litter and microplastics in Central America

Component 2: improving the ESM of plastic waste

 Review the legal framework to guarantee the ESM of plastic waste
