The Plastic Waste Amendments

Annex II	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• New entry Y48, covering plastic waste, including mixtures of such waste, unless these are hazardous (Annex VIII) or presumed to not be hazardous (Annex IX)	Subject to the prior informed consent (PIC) procedure
Annex VIII	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• New entry A3210, clarifying scope of plastic wastes presumed to be hazardous	
Annex IX	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• New entry B3011, replacing B3010, clarifying the types of plastic wastes presumed to not be hazardous	

➤ **The new entries become effective as of 1 January 2021.**

Budget: USD 1.78 million

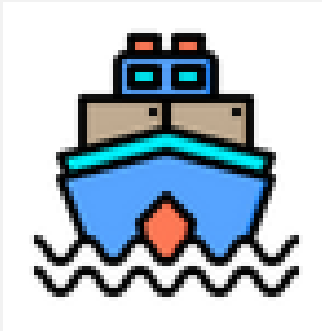
