Preparations for UNEA-3 - Making a Commitment to Beat Pollution

The Secretariat makes reference to the upcoming United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA-3), organised by the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) in Nairobi, Kenya from 4-6 December 2017, which focuses on pollution, and on the development of a political commitment from countries "Towards a Pollution-Free World".

To this end, UN Environment launched the campaign #BeatPollution, through which it is calling on governments, businesses, civil society organizations and other interested groups or institutions to join the fight to beat pollution. The "Beat Pollution" campaign, has already registered more than a half million pledges to clean up the planet. Here are a few examples of the types of commitments UNEP has received:


- A company that pledges to improve its energy efficiency or replace a harmful product with a better one
- A civil society group that commits to take up pollution as a campaign issue or organize a series of beach clean-ups,
- A government that commits to embrace sustainable procurement or phase out single-use plastic bags.
