Follow-up to the face-to-face segment of the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Basel Convention

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1. Strategic framework

Decision: BC-15/3: Strategic framework

Background:

In part I of decision BC-15/3 on the strategic framework, the Conference of the Parties decided, among other things, to improve the strategic framework for 2012–2021 and that the small intersessional working group on the strategic framework would continue its work and be open to all Parties inviting representation of the five regional groups of the United Nations, and to observers, including the Basel Convention regional and coordinating centres.

In part II of decision BC-15/3 on the strategic framework, the Conference of the Parties, among other things, invited Parties and observers to submit to the Secretariat, by 30 November 2022, information on challenges in the implementation of the prior informed consent procedure and on best practices, possible approaches, initiatives and views to improve the functioning of the prior informed consent procedure, recognizing that developing countries faced increasing challenges in implementation of the prior informed consent procedure and that they needed further financial and technical assistance and capacity-building to address those challenges.

2. Developing guidelines for environmentally sound management

Decision: BC-15/5: Developing guidelines for environmentally sound management

Background:

In decision BC-15/5, the Conference of the Parties adopted the revised draft practical manual for stakeholders to ensure that notifications of transboundary movements meet environmentally sound management requirements.¹

The Conference of the Parties, among other things, invited Parties and others to undertake activities to use, promote and disseminate the toolkit on environmentally sound management. It also invited Parties and others to provide the Secretariat with information on the environmentally sound management of hazardous wastes and other wastes, in particular, activities, initiatives and case studies that may promote implementation and complement the toolkit.

It recalled the invitation to Parties and others contained in decision BC-13/3 to submit to the Secretariat further good practices and examples with regard to waste prevention and minimization and extended it to 31 December 2022.

3. <u>Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of wastes consisting of, containing</u> <u>or contaminated with persistent organic pollutants</u>

<u>Decision:</u> BC-15/6: Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of wastes consisting of, containing or contaminated with persistent organic pollutants

Background:

In decision BC-15/6, the Conference of the Parties, among other things, adopted the technical guidelines listed below:

- General technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of wastes consisting of, containing or contaminated with persistent organic pollutants;¹
- Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of wastes consisting of, containing or contaminated with perfluorooctane sulfonic acid (PFOS), its salts and perfluorooctane sulfonyl fluoride (PFOSF) and perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA), its salts and PFOA-related compounds;²
- Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of wastes consisting of, containing or contaminated with the pesticides aldrin, alpha hexachlorocyclohexane, beta hexachlorocyclohexane, chlordane, chlordecone, dicofol, dieldrin, endrin, heptachlor, hexachlorobenzene, hexachlorobutadiene, lindane, mirex, pentachlorobenzene, pentachlorophenol and its salts, perfluorooctane sulfonic acid, its salts and perfluorooctane sulfonyl fluoride, technical endosulfan and its related isomers or toxaphene or with hexachlorobenzene as an industrial chemical.³

The Conference of the Parties decided to continue working towards a review of provisional low persistent organic pollutant content values in the general technical guidelines and other technical guidelines, as appropriate, before the sixteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties. It also decided to update the general technical guidelines and the specific technical guidelines with regard to the chemicals listed in Annex A to the Stockholm Convention by decision SC-10/13 of the Conference of the Parties to the Stockholm Convention.

Background:

In decision BC-15/7, the Conference of the Parties decided to extend the mandate of the expert working group established by paragraph 5 of decision BC-13/5. It requested it to prepare updated technical guidelines, taking into consideration the comments received on the results of the use and/or testing of the technical guidelines, the amendments to Annexes II, VIII and IX to the Basel Convention adopted in decision BC-15/18 and paragraph 4 of decision BC-14/5, and to submit them for the consideration of the Conference of the Parties at its sixteenth meeting.

5. <u>Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of plastic wastes</u>

Decision: BC-15/10: Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of plastic wastes

Background:

The Conference of the Parties underscores the importance of the timely updating of the technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of plastic wastes and noted the progress achieved during the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties towards their finalization, as reflected in the draft updated technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of plastic wastes.¹

The Conference of the Parties decided to extend the mandate of the small intersessional working group established pursuant to paragraph 20 of decision BC-14/13. It invited the Governments of China, Japan and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, as co-lead countries, in consultation with the small intersessional working group, to prepare a further updated version of the technical guidelines, taking into account the discussion during the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties and the general comments and textual proposals to be received during the intersessional period, for consideration by the Open-ended Working Group at its thirteenth meeting.

<u>Decision</u>: BC-15/11: Technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of waste lead-acid batteries and on other waste batteries

Background:

The Conference of the Parties decided that the technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of waste lead-acid batteries should be updated.¹ It also decided that technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of waste batteries other than waste lead-acid batteries should be developed.

The Conference further decided to establish a small intersessional working group to undertake, as a priority and a matter of urgency, the updating of the technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of waste lead-acid batteries, as well as to develop the technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of waste batteries other than waste lead-acid batteries.

The Conference of the Parties welcomed with appreciation the offer of Uruguay to act as a lead country in the updating of the technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of waste lead-acid batteries and invited Parties to consider serving as co-lead country of their willingness to do so.

9. Further consideration of plastic waste

Decision: BC-15/15: Further consideration of plastic waste

Background:

The Conference of the Parties decided to update the technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of used and waste pneumatic tyres.¹ It also decided to establish a small intersessional working group, operating by electronic means and, subject to the availability of resources, through face-to-face meetings, to undertake the updating of the guidelines.

The Conference of the Parties invited Parties and others to provide comments to the Secretariat on whether technical guidelines on the environmentally sound management of rubber wastes (entry B3040) and waste parings and scrap of rubber (entry B3080) should be developed. The Secretariat was requested to prepare a compilation of the comments received for consideration by the Open-ended Working Group at its thirteenth meeting.

It also invited Parties and others to provide comments to the Secretariat on possible further activities that could be conducted under the Basel Convention in response to developments in scientific knowledge and environmental information related to plastic waste as a source of land pollution, marine plastic litter and microplastics.² The Secretariat was requested to make available the comments received on the website of the Convention, and to suggest possible further activities that could be conducted under the Convention in response to developments in scientific knowledge and environmental information and health impacts related to plastic waste as a source of land pollution, marine plastic litter and microplastics, taking into consideration the comments received and the work undertaken in follow-up to UNEA resolution 5/14 entitled "End plastic pollution: towards an international legally binding instrument", as appropriate, for consideration by the Openended Working Group at its thirteenth meeting and by the Conference of the Parties at its sixteenth meeting.

11. Providing further legal clarity

Decision: BC-15/19: Providing further legal clarity

Background:

The Conference of the Parties welcomed the work undertaken by the expert working group on the review of Annexes I, III and IV and entries A1180 in Annex VIII and B1110 in Annex IX to the Basel Convention. It recalled the mandate of the expert working group as set out in decisions BC-13/2, BC 14/13 and BC-14/16 and decided to remove the review of entries A1180 in Annex VIII and B1110 in Annex IX from the mandate of the group, while acknowledging the need for further discussion on amendments to Annex IV - for example, on the issues listed in paragraphs 4 (a) - 4 (f) of decision BC-15/19.

The Conference of the Parties requested the Open-ended Working Group to consider the proposals by the European Union to amend Annex IV and certain entries in Annexes II and IX to the Basel Convention¹ and the recommendations and findings of the expert working group², taking into account the discussions at the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties, as well as the progress made in the review of Annexes I and III, and to provide recommendations for consideration by the Conference of the Parties at its sixteenth meeting.

12. <u>National legislation, notifications, enforcement of the Convention and efforts to combat illegal</u> <u>traffic</u>

<u>Decision</u>: BC-15/20: National legislation, notifications, enforcement of the Convention and efforts to combat illegal traffic

Background:

National legislation to implement and enforce the Convention, as well as efforts to prevent and combat illegal traffic were issues highlighted by the Conference of the Parties. In decision BC-15/20, the Conference of the Parties focused on various aspects for further work in this regard, including: active engagement of enforcement organizations and networks in preventing and combating illegal traffic; and their collaboration with the Secretariat on activities aimed at assisting Parties to prevent and combat illegal traffic; Parties' obligations to update or develop national legislation; providing information on national definitions of hazardous wastes as well as import/export restrictions or prohibitions; sharing information including on best practices in preventing and combating illegal traffic; and reporting confirmed cases of illegal traffic to the Secretariat.

13. <u>Basel Convention Partnership Programme</u>

Decision: BC-15/22: Basel Convention Partnership Programme

Background:

In part I of decision BC-15/22, the Conference of the Parties invited Parties, signatories and all other stakeholders, including manufacturers, recyclers, refurbishers, academia, relevant e-waste platforms, non-governmental and intergovernmental organizations and former partners of the Partnership for Action on Computing Equipment to communicate to the Secretariat their wish to be admitted as a member of the working group of the Partnership.

In part III of decision BC-15/22, the Conference of the Parties took note of the draft overall guidance document on the environmentally sound management of household waste developed by the Household Waste Partnership working group.¹ Parties and others were invited to provide further comments on the draft overall guidance to the Secretariat by 15 October 2022.

The Conference of the Parties requested the working group to prepare, by 15 December 2022, a revised draft of the overall guidance document, taking into account the comments received prior and during the fifteenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties; any additional comments received by 15 October 2022; and the outcomes of pilot projects or testing of the draft overall guidance document undertaken by Parties, and taking into careful consideration existing guidance under the Convention, for consideration by the Conference of the Parties and others to provide comments on the revised draft of the overall guidance document prepared by the working group to the Secretariat by 15 February 2023, and requests the Secretariat to publish the comments received on the Convention website and prepare a compilation of those comments for consideration by the Conference of the Parties at its sixteenth meeting.
