Environmentally Sound Management of Waste or Used Lead Acid Batteries

Focus:

In 2017, at its third session, the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA3), adopted Resolution UNEP/EA.3/Res.9 on Eliminating Exposure to Lead Paint and Promoting Environmentally Sound Management (ESM) of Waste Lead-Acid Batteries (WLAB). The resolution called on UNEP to continue to assist countries, in particular developing countries and countries with economies in transition, in their efforts to strengthen and enhance the national, subregional and regional implementation of environmentally sound management of waste, subject to the availability of resources, including by providing further capacity-building with respect to waste lead-acid batteries to implement regulatory frameworks and programmes for recycling, and better track and trace shipments, in close cooperation with the secretariat of the Basel Convention.

The event will highlight challenges, opportunities and best practices/solutions that exist in ESM of WLAB and the Africa Guidance Manual on WLAB recently developed by UNEP.
